5.1.2 Significant points gained from student evaluation results

The students' course evaluation results show that the course objectives and learning outcomes were clearly understood and well-received. In every class meeting, students were clearly informed of what was expected of them to learn and gain from each unit lesson; they were well aware of what they were expected to learn. The results also show that the learning activities were considered appropriate and that students understood that they were completing the tasks so they could apply the theoretical knowledge they learned in the lessons to the tasks that they needed to complete.

5.1.3 Teacher's opinions regarding the evaluation results from 1.2

For all the topics that were planned for the course, I made certain that students knew and understood the purpose of assigning those tasks, and that they knew what they needed to do to accomplish them. Immediate feedback and suggestions were given as students went on completing the activities.

5.2 Course evaluation using other methods (if any)

5.2.1 Significant points gained from the course evaluation using other methods

The course assessment results reveal that 29.33% of the 75 total number of students (Sections B and C) received a grade of A, amounting to 22 students. 30.67% of the students amounting to 23 received the grade of B+, 20 students received a grade of B (26.67%), while seven got C+ (9.33%). Two students (2.67%) received a grade of D+. One student (from section C) was given an 'Incomplete' grade (I) for they missed submitting the course requirements. Finally, one student from section B withdrew from the course, and consequently did not complete the course. The grades were based on the accumulated scores of individual and group tasks such as group and individual writing activities and assignments, and summative assessment (midterm and final exams). It is also worth noting that the students' understanding of the tasks and their purpose helped motivate the students to complete and finish their work.

5.2.2 Teacher's opinions regarding the evaluation results from 2.1

Based on the course assessment results, it can be concluded that with the learning objectives clearly explained to the students, they will be more willing and motivated to complete the tasks they are assigned to do. As the teacher and with much consideration of the results of the assessment, I believe some techniques can be improved to motivate students to work hard and give their best in completing the tasks.
